Mr. Bobby Leonard Moore, age 64 of Calhoun, passed away Friday, January 23, 2009 at Emory University Hospital. He was born on November 29, 1944 in Cobb County, son of the late Allen Moore and Nettie Reddings Moore, and was also preceded in death by his wife, Vera Blanchard Moore. During his lifetime he served his country, and retired from the United States Army, having served in the Vietnam War. He also retired from the North American Container Corporation.
