Mr. Charles Edward Hall, Sr., age 65 of Rome, Georgia, died Wednesday, September 12, 2007 at Floyd Medical Center following a brief illness.

Mr. Hall was born on February 8, 1942 in Bartow County, son of the late Robert Jasper Hall and Pearl Grace Buttrum Hall.
