



## Glenn Johnson

November 30, 1931 - February 14, 2009

Mr. Doyle Glenn Johnson, better known as "Rinso and Soda Pop", age 77 of Fairmount, passed away Saturday, February 14, 2009 at the Cartersville Medical Center following eight months of illness.
