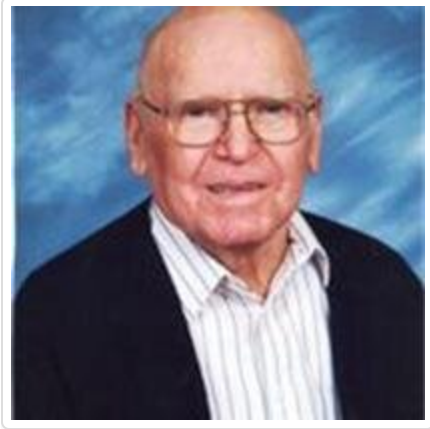




J. Williams

Mr. J. B. Williams, age 91 of Calhoun, passed away January 15, 2008 at Hamilton Medical Center.
