Mr. Kenneth Randolph Bailey, age 80 of Resaca, GA died Monday November 19, 2012 in Redmond Medical Center following an extended period of declining health.

Mr. Bailey was born on August 19, 1932 in Floyd County, GA, son of the late Q.C. and Viola Carter Bailey. He was Veteran of the United States Army, having served during the Korean War. He was retired from Textile Rubber Inc. after 32 years of employment, and was a member and deacon of Hillcrest Baptist Church.
