



## Norman Stephens

February 10, 1930 - December 18, 2010

Mr. Norman Lee Stephens, age 80 of Calhoun, died Saturday, December 18, 2010 at his residence following an extended illness. Mr. Stephens was born in McCreary County, Kentucky on February 10th, 1930, son of the late William and Zada Crabtree Jones Stephens. He and his wife had resided in Calhoun for the past four years, moving here from Memphis, TN. Mr. Stephens was a veteran of the United States Army, and was retired from the U.S. Postal Service. He was a Seventh Day Adventist.
